Name Tags

Membership name tags for this financial year have been printed and placed in plastic holders in the "name tag" drawer opposite the kitchen door. Old tags have been removed and are no longer current. The new tags show a blue currency date at the bottom right whereas last year's tags were maroon. Members who are not up to date with their annual contribution no longer have a tag and insurance coverage is questionable. Tags for some new members who have paid since February, have not yet been printed. If, after another week, your name tag is still missing, please inform a Coordinator who can notify Malcolm and he can check our records. Would members please check that the information, including emergency contact details on the back, is correct or ensure that the Shed is notified of changes or errors.

The following contains information about the name tags:

During your time at the Shed, you are asked to wear your name tag to help promote social interaction and help get to know each other. It assists when communicating with others and engenders a sense of belonging. Your name tag shows important details to assist in recognition of expertise. They show those qualified in first-aid, Coordinators, accreditation independently use equipment, annual contribution (and hence insurance) currency and emergency contact details. Tags are usually kept in the drawer at the Shed to allow for updating.
