Hi everyone,

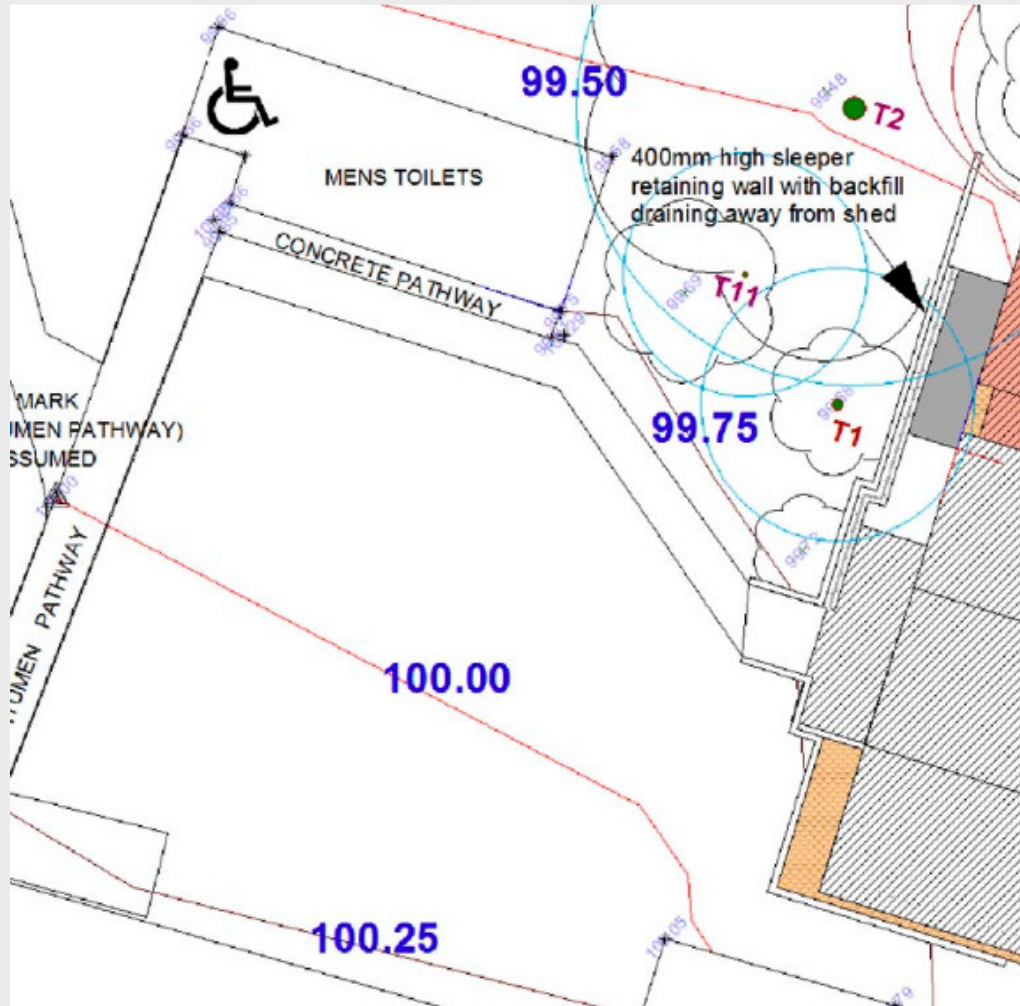

Call for volunteers from our volunteers

Council has given the go-ahead to do the work below with Council doing the back fill. We are seeking volunteers to put the sleeper retaining wall in.....please contact Malcolm or Mike, either of them will supervise the work.

Thanks in advance for your kind contribution in offering your time to improve the drainage around the Shed. We hope to add an additional sleeper retaining wall from the northern side of the Shed access path. It may need to be up to 400 mm in height. If needed, we may also need to add an extra sleeper height to the existing wall ie total height of 400 mm, on the Douglas Pickering Pavilion side and extend this wall further east between the two buildings.
